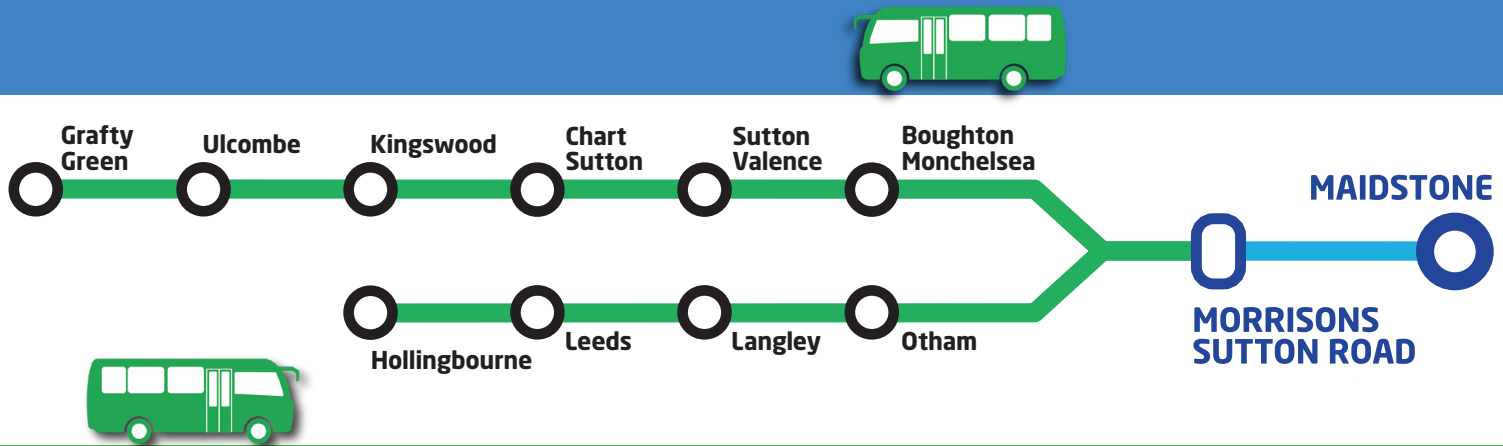


Maidstone bus pilot consultation

Proposed changes to the 13 & 59 bus services



Last year Kent County Council launched the Big Conversation to explore innovative and sustainable ways of providing transport to rural communities in Kent.

We have used the results of the consultation to develop a number of pilot schemes to test out the ideas.

We are proposing to revise **the 59 service** (Grafty Green – Maidstone) and **the 13 service** (Hollingbourne - Maidstone) operated by Arriva and Nu-Venture, to provide more frequent journey

opportunities for the villages currently served.

In order to facilitate these extra journeys, these services would become feeder buses and they would no longer run all the way into Maidstone. Instead, they would terminate at Morrisons, Sutton Road where users could change onto high frequency buses into Maidstone or Tenterden.
